## Western North Carolina Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes June 20, 2019

Bridget O'Malley introduced Didi Salvatierra & Sheila Solen representing Quilts of Valor. They recognized members of QOV and awarded three quilts to the following individuals: Betty Burkholder, Judy Thurman and Bonnie Hartel, (Judy and Bonnie are current guild members).

Sheryl Jamerson reported the finances from the May quilt show and thanked the many volunteers, including husbands, that made the show possible.

Bridget said the Board designated the 4 geographic areas by their old/original numbers that make up the Guild: 1, 2, 5 and 8. The list of charities is being edited to be more accurate. She announced that the Carolina Shop Hop is July 12-20 and includes 11 shops, operating from 9:30-5:30, Mon-Sat. Bridget also announced the next quilt retreat will be Sept 24-26 at Bonclarken.

Barbara Dexter-Smith related that the Scholarship Committee is benefiting from the sale of two estates from quilters and the long arm machine lottery was won by Karen-Eve Bayne. Barbara has fabric for sale at the break.

Bonnie Hartel stated National Quilt Day will be March 21, 2020 with the theme, "This is my Home," for placemat-size quilts that may be donated to Meals on Wheels after the show. (There is not a specific fabric designated for this year's challenge.) Location is still pending. She introduced the Mountain State Fair and encouraged members to enter quilts and sign up for shifts to volunteer (to take in, hang and return quilts and to sit and sew in the Heritage Building).

Linda Lou Harris reviewed upcoming programs. After Show and Tell the meeting adjourned at 10:45. After the break we were entertained by Lisa Alley with "What WAS She Thinking? Through the eyes of a Quilt Show Judge. Secretary, Bonnie Hartel

Ladies, please bring your fabric scraps 4 1/2" or 5 1/2 " squares to a Guild meeting and I will collect them. Once again we have been fortunate to have a quilt booth in the Heritage Building. We will be working with children and handicapped persons sewing four squares together to make their first quilt block. As much fun as it is for the children, it really impresses the parents.

The Fair runs from Sept. 6th thru Sept. 15th. We invite you to volunteer in the booth and you may sell any quilt related items during your shift.

Last year we had such a great volunteer group! If you choose not to wear the period costumes, you may wear an apron over your clothes. Please consider volunteering for a shift or two. You may bring a project to work on during your shift, people love to talk to you about your projects and stories of quilting from their families. We will also be selling tickets for the raffle quilt benefitting the Scholarship Fund, another good conversation topic.

Sign ups will be available at the Guild meetings. Please bring your donated squares to the meetings or call me and I will arrange to pick them up.

The theme this year is the importance of education about agriculture, with the name "Ag-Knowledge Agriculture". So don't put those quilts away, enter them in the Fair.

There are several classes for quilts but they must be made between Sept. 2018 and Sept. 2019. You can enter on line by going to: [www.wncagcenter.org/p/mountainstatefair](http://www.wncagcenter.org/p/mountainstatefair). Scroll down to: Division I General Exhibits. Read the rules under General Exhibits. Quilting is HE with 13 classes to enter. You can only get one ribbon per class and the online entry must be in by 11:55 pm on August 23.

You bring your quilts to the fairgrounds (Expo Bldg.) on Sept 2 & 3, Labor Day Monday & Tuesday, from 9am to 7pm.

Clothing is another department that has a quilted section for purses, bags, jackets & sweatshirts. HD is Senior Citizen Crafts which is age specific and includes a "quilted item".

These categories are judged with monetary prizes & ribbons.

Remember you can enter as many categories as you want but you can only get one ribbon per category. Let's show off these beautiful creations.

It was decided the Guild will have four Areas: 1, 2, 5 and 8. Decision on colors is still pending.

Linda announced that the Carolina Shop Hop will be July 12-20. After some discussion the nominating committee was created with the following members: Bridget O'Malley, Linda Gillette and Linda Lou Harris. They will determine which positions need to be filled and call members seeking opportunities. A suggestion was made to have a meeting of incoming and off going board members for a smoother transition.
